




Results

- The pre-study explores the role and potential of vocational education institutions as research, development, and innovation (RDI) actors in the Uusimaa region of Finland, emphasizing their importance in the region's innovation ecosystem.
- Despite that there are no legislation or funding and that traditionally VET actors has been playing a minor role in RDI activities, there is a growing recognition of the vocational institutions' potential to contribute significantly to regional development and meet the rapidly changing needs of the workforce.
- 72% of respondents strongly or somewhat agreed that their VET institution is involved in RDI projects to develop its own activities in order to meet the changing needs of business and industry.




In terms of staff skills, our institution is well prepared to participate in RDI activities.

Ideas for the future

It would be good if everyone had an RDI mindset. The future employee should be development-oriented, able to improve their own work and the company's operations, says Satu Koivisto, Director of Research and Development at Haaga-Helia University of Applied Sciences.

Future skills needs will indeed increase the need for cooperation, including research cooperation. Practicality should also be emphasised in research, with a direct link to development activities in the sector. This requires strong business networks and cooperation with universities and universities of applied sciences," says Pia Pakarinen, Managing Director of the Helsinki Region Chamber of Commerce.



Ideas for the future

Applied research in VET is unique in its ability to integrate research and innovation and to deeply understand industrial challenges, while promoting change in the workplace and enabling VET to contribute to solving these challenges. This requires an investigative approach, reflective action, effective communication and collaboration to create and share knowledge, says Ragnhild Scaalid from European Comission.

Stefan Thomas of the European Training Foundation (ETF) believes that *vocational training institutions should focus in particular on small and micro enterprises*. These companies are in demand for practical applied research and cooperation in development and innovation, as universities are concentrating on larger companies.



Our institution wants to be involved in Centres of Vocational Excellence (CoVE) projects funded by the European Commission.


